Installation is at the purchaser's expense and will vary according to the work and the site.

Commissions

We can arrange commissions, editions and source other works by the artists in current and past exhibitions.

Entry

Entry is by koha. A koha is a reciprocal contribution recognising that we are sharing our home with you. We have been asked for guidance - most people contribute \$20-25 per adult.

Guided tours

Guided tours are available at \$40 per adult, by prior arrangement. People who have been on a tour may also explore freely afterwards.

Health and safety






